Call for Papers

Researchers and practitioners are invited to submit abstracts describing original research, policy analysis, or case studies related to energy economics and policy. Abstracts should clearly outline the background and motivation of the research, the methodology, the key findings, the conclusions, and the policy relevance.

All abstracts must follow the structure outlined in the Conference abstract template and should not exceed two pages. All submissions, including abstracts, papers, and presentations, must be in English or Arabic. Abstracts must be submitted **online** through the Conference website, with additional submission information available on the Conference **website**.

Important Dates

- Abstract submission deadline: **3 October 2026**
- Rolling notification of abstract acceptance: Abstracts are reviewed on a rolling basis. Authors who submit early will be notified before the **3 October** deadline. Authors who submit by the deadline will be notified by **15 October**.

Submission Information

Those offering to make presentations must submit an abstract that briefly describes their research or case study. Along with an overview, the abstract must include a description of the background and potential significance of the work, methodology, results, conclusions, and references, where applicable. All abstracts must conform to the format outlined on the Conference website. Abstracts should only be submitted through the Conference website's abstract submission system. For every accepted abstract, one author must attend the Conference to present their work.

- Only one paper per author can be presented at the Conference.
- Authors can submit multiple abstracts, but if more than one paper is accepted, one of the co-authors must register to present it.
- The title of the abstract cannot be changed after it has been accepted.

Authors will be notified on a rolling basis, but no later than **15 October 2026**, of the status of their abstract submission. The Conference will be held in person only, with no online participation.

Conference Venue

The 4th IAEE MENA Conference will be held at the KAPSARC campus in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia.

The Conference aims to engage a diverse audience with interests in energy economics, encompassing:
